Return to Public Masses

We are concerned for the safety of everybody so at a recent Pastoral Council meeting we decided on the following safety measures:

- Hand sanitisers are available at each church. We ask you to avail of these as you enter the Church.
- If you wish you may stay in your car and listen to mass on outside speaker and we will bring you Holy Communion.
- We ask you to adhere to social distancing by being aware of the signs on the floor.
- Families are welcome to sit together, two people per seat from different households (seated on either side of the seat). Stewards will quide you to your place.
- Eucharistic Ministers will wear face masks and sanitise hands before giving out Holy Communion.
- Speakers are installed outside so if anybody wants to stay outside they are welcome to do that too.

Eucharistic Minister will come up to you.

- Because of Covid 19 we won't be passing around the baskets for our collection as usual. Baskets will be placed at each church door so that

WAR OF INDEPENDENCE COMMEMORATION IN MULLAGH. There is a War of Independence commemoration planned for Sunday October 17th in Mullagh, outside the church gates after 11am Mass. This will include the unveiling of a plaque, the laying of a wreath and a roll of honour. This commemoration is in memory of the Volunteers of the 4th Battalion West Clare Brigade, Irish Republican Army 1919-1921, from A /Company Mullagh, B/Company Coore, C/Company Knocknahilla, D/Company Kilmurry Ibrickane, E/Company Quilty and their comrades in Cumann na mBán. The keynote speaker will be Eoin Shanahan author of 'The hand that held the gun'. All are welcome to attend as we remember and commemorate the great fortitude, strength and spirit of these brave men and women, our own predecessors and those of our neighbours one hundred years later.

<u>DECADE OF CENTENARIES</u>: Oidhreacht an Chláir presents a lecture, _The War of Independence: events in Miltown Malbay and district, 1920-21_, by Dr Pádraig Óg Ó Ruairc (historian and author of several books on the period) on Saturday, October 16 at 8.00pm in the Community Centre, Miltown. As part of this commemorative project, which is supported by the Department of Tourism, Culture, Arts, Gaeltacht, Sport and Media under the Community Strand of the Decade of Centenaries programme, through Clare Co. Council, we shall also make, as a historical record for future generations, a video recording (with commentary) of the eight houses in Miltown attacked and burnt by Crown Forces in the reprisals of 1920 and 1921.
