BIBLICAL INSTITUTE SCRIPTURES SERIES: The next lecture "I Lift Up My Eyes to the Mountains: The Bible and Ecology" – Dr Celine Mangan will take place on Thursday 18 October at 7.30pm. at the Dominican Biblical institute.
