Advent Wreath

"The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light" Light is the most powerful symbol of the Advent Season. For the four weeks before Christmas, the people of God wait in prayerful hope for the coming of the Messiah.

The four candles of the Advent Season represent the four weeks of Advent and the thousands of years that the people of God awaited the promised Messiah. Three of the candles are purple in colour, a reminder of the Spirit of prayer that marks the advent season. One candle is rose representing "Joyful Sunday". Each week one candle is lit until all four are aglow on the fourth Sunday of Advent.

The round wreath symbolises the eternity of God and Gods presence throughout human history. The evergreens remind us that Gods love never comes to an end.

On Christmas Eve the fifth candle is lit symbol of Christs coming into the world.

Father of all creation and Lord of light
bless our wreath of evergreen and candles.

Be present among us as we come together
to celebrate in scripture the coming of Christ.

May our hearts and minds reflect the light of these candles
that Christmas will find us joyfully ready to receive the
Saviour Jesus Christ.
