We warmly welcome everybody back. We are concerned for the safety of everybody so at a recent Pastoral Council meeting we decided on the following safety measures:

- Hand sanitisers are available at each church. We ask 1. you to avail of these as you enter the Church.
- 2. We ask you to adhere to social distancing by being aware of the signs on the floor.
- 3. Families are welcome to sit together, two people per seat from different households (seated on either side of the seat) Stewards will guide you to your place.
- 4. Eucharistic Ministers will wear face masks and sanitise hands before giving out Holy Communion, we ask you if possible to receive Holy Communion on your hand. These measures are to keep everybody safe, we really look forward to welcoming you back.

Dear Parishioners

I hope that you and all your families and loved ones continue to stay safe and well. As the current crisis continues to be part of our community and church life, new guidance is becoming available to us daily. It has now become the common practice in many Dioceses that there would be a strong encouragement for people who attend Mass or other Liturgies in churches to wear face masks. Getting Back on Track Financially

Most of us have some level of debt, but when unpaid debt becomes such a burden that it prevents you from getting out of bed in the morning, brings a sense of dread when answering the phone or opening the post, it is time to take control of the situation.

The unfortunate reality is that due to the impact of COVID-19 many more people in Ireland may be struggling to pay their debts having recently lost their jobs or struggling to make ends meet on reduced incomes.

The effects of problem debt on a person's wellbeing and mental health can be severe and can prevent them coming forward for help but there is a solution to every debt problem and this is where the Insolvency Service of Ireland (ISI) can help.

The ISI is the independent government body with four debt solutions to help people with all levels of problem debt - from credit cards to mortgages. It regulates debt advisors called Personal Insolvency

Practitioners (PIPs).

You could be insolvent if:

you can't pay your bills in full when they are due

You're paying a little off each bill trying to keep creditors at bay You've had calls and letters about missed repayments and threats of epossession.

If you are insolvent and in arrears on your home mortgage you could also be eligible for a free consultation with a PIP under the State-

funded Abhaile Scheme. The purpose of that Scheme is to help people in serious arrears to find the best available solutions, with the help of professional advisors. The priority will be to find a
