**Fr. Michael Doohan**

Fr. Michael was laid to rest in Dalgan, Co Meath on  
Wednesday last. Fr. Mick was born on 4<sup>th</sup> of March  
1928 at the Hand. He was ordained a Priest in 1952.  
He went to the Phillipines in 1953 and was assigned  
to Negros where he spent sixty years working with  
the poor. Fr. Mick set up a school where the poor  
men of the area could learn to be a mechanic and  
lift themselves out of poverty. He was also a fore-  
runner in caring for the planet, he was involved in  
planting trees on a huge scale that addresses the  
de-forestation that was taking place in the  
Phillipines at the time. Fr. Mick had a deep love for  
this area and for the people of Coore and loved to  
come back and say mass in our Church. May his  
gentle soul rest in peace.
